HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Welcome to a much shorter and very unusual AGS newsletter. In this brief update, we have focused on the time spent during the national lockdown from January to March and the way in which we were able to reopen school to all staff and students. There is lots happening in school at the moment, with all of the usual learning as well as additional preparation and support for those students who have had their exams cancelled. We are starting to see the return of the extra-curricular activities which add to the rich and varied experience of our students - as COVID restrictions are gradually lifted, and we are beginning the series of virtual parents' evenings which will run from now until the end of term. I am very pleased to report that we are over-subscribed again this year, with more families wanting a place in Year 7 this September than we have places for. This is the fourth year in succession that this has been the case. Thank you for all that you continue to do to make our school this good. In addition to another large intake in Year 7, we have currently 109 applications for Year 12 in September, with lots of students wanting to be part of our small (but perfectly formed) Sixth Form!

COVID TESTING IN SCHOOL

Our testing took place in the minor hall. Usually used for sporting activities in PE, such as basketball and gymnastics, it was taken over by tables, screens, anti-viral wipes and Covid-19 testing kits. Thank you to parents who booked appointments online for their children to take part in the testing via our Insight system. This made the booking process go smoothly and efficiently. Students made their own way down to the minor hall to get their test. Once there, they registered with a barcode, then they went and sat at a table with a volunteer to do the test. Once their test was done they registered it and waited for the results. Throughout the three weeks we were very happy to report that we didn't have any positive test results and are very excited for all our students to be back in school!

As you can see from the photo above, the testing room was set out so that all the testing stations were two metres apart. Due to the support of our staff and a large team of volunteers it was a well planned and organised event.

At AGS we are very proud to say that throughout the three weeks of whole school testing, our students and staff (including our exam invigilators and site team) and volunteers (including Gell Friends, parents, ex students and trustees) did a fantastic job! Thank you to our excellent students who completed their testing without fuss in an efficient and helpful way, which was really appreciated. And a big thank you to our super team of staff and volunteers who processed over 3200 tests and helped make our testing process so successful. We had 15 volunteers helping out and they

were a key part of our testing. They registered the students when they came for their tests, they were cleaning the stations between students, instructing students on how to administer each test, timing the tests to achieve an accurate result and then registering the student's results.

Once the testing in school had been completed, students and staff were given home testing kits so they could administer tests at home. This is going well, with the tests being carried out on Sunday and Wednesday evenings.

Overall, it was a challenging time for the school which was undertaken with a positive attitude, smiling faces and hard word from all involved.


