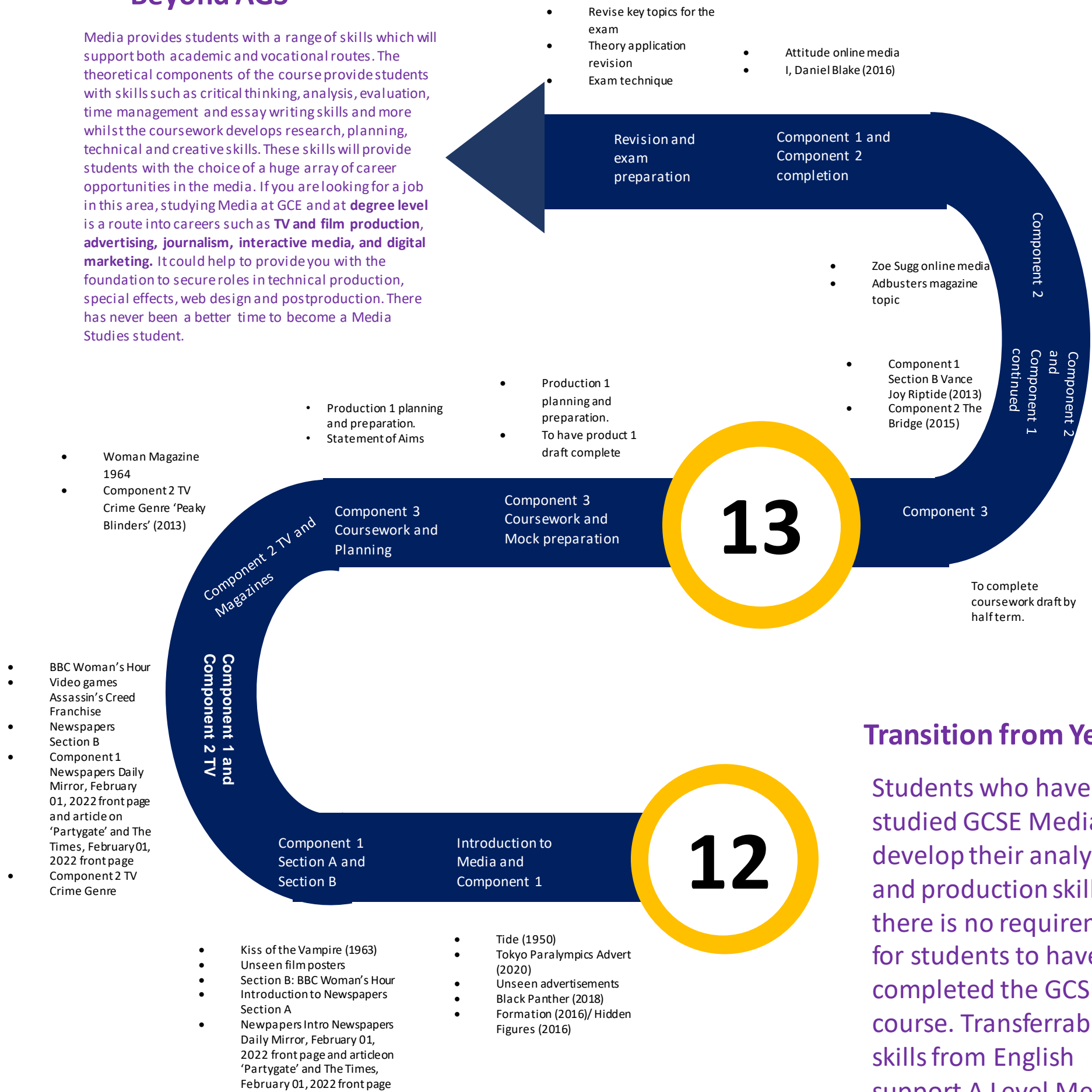




Beyond AGS
