From January –Easter, students work on a new PowerPoint presentation. This is to collate all research, edits, experimental documentation and presentation ideas.

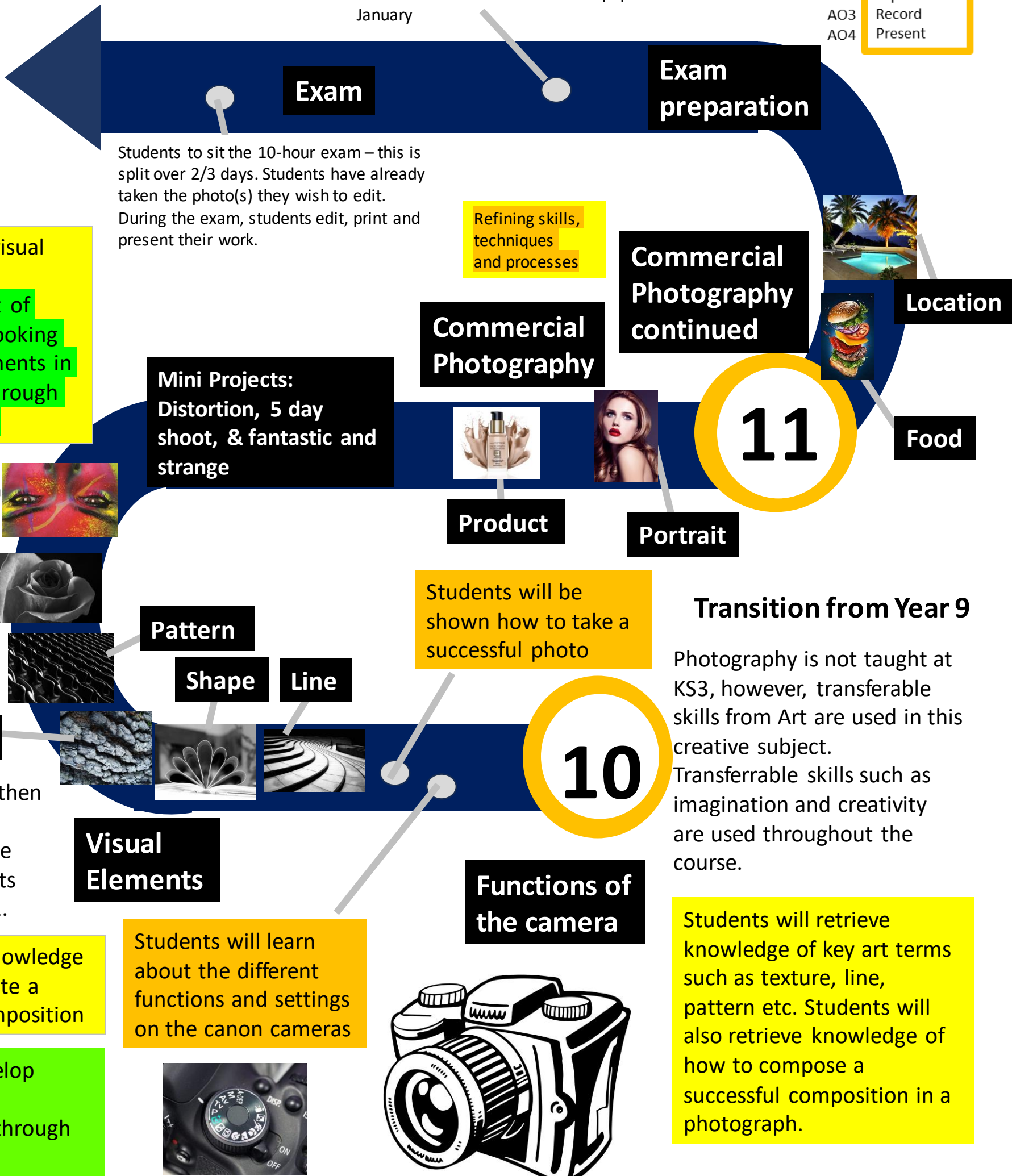
Students receive their OCR exam papers in January

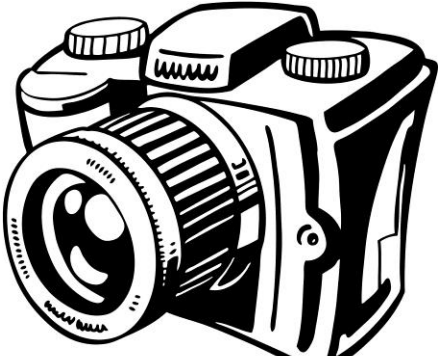
