Child Sexual Exploitation

Guidance on appropriate language for multi-agency professionals to use when talking about child exploitation and abuse. The guide sets out: the impact of victim blaming language; key considerations when speaking with people who have experienced exploitation and abuse; and terms that should be avoided. <u>Appropriate language guide</u>

Derby and Derbyshire Safeguarding Childrens Partnership Key Documents

The updates to the following important documents are now published in the <u>DDSCP Documents</u> <u>Library</u>, could all agencies please share widely within their organisations.

- <u>Derby City and Derbyshire Threshold Document</u> Effective support for babies, children, young people and their families within Derby City and Derbyshire County This document has been reviewed throughout and the Threshold contains 10 themed sections of indicators of possible needs to support practitioners.
- <u>Multi Agency Dispute Resolution and Escalation Protocol</u> and <u>Template</u> This document has been reviewed throughout and strengthened to support practitioners when faced with professional disagreement and challenge.
- <u>Derby City and Derbyshire Local Protocol for Assessment and Support</u> This is a new document requiring publication under Working Together 2023

Briefing Sessions on the revised Threshold and Escalation will be rolled out from January through to March 2025 and will be hosted through the DDSCP Learning and Development Team. These will be available to book from January 2025 via the <u>DDSCP training booking system</u>.

Best practice guides

Derby and Derbyshire Safeguarding Children Partnership (DDSCP) have produced three best practice guides to support practitioners when working with children and families where **child in need plans, personal health budgets or special guardianship orders** are a feature.

Practitioners including front line staff, team managers and senior managers from a variety of agencies across Derby and Derbyshire have helped to create these guides, along with input from families.
