What do I need to revise for Geography success?

Your Component 1 exam (Investigating Geographical Issues) will assess your knowledge and understanding of each of the three themes that you have covered throughout the GCSE course. These are:

Theme 1: Changing Places – Changing Economies

- Urbanisation in contrasting global cities
- Urban and rural processes and change in the UK
- A global perspective on development issues



Theme 2: Changing Environments


- Coasts and coastal management
- Rivers and river management
- Weather and climate
- Climate change cause and effect

Theme 3: Environmental challenges

- How ecosystems function
- Ecosystems under threat
- Water resources and management
- Desertification

Your **Component 2** exam is a decision making paper. The exam will draw on any of the topics from the list above to test your understanding of the Geography surrounding the topic. As you've seen before the exam then introduces an issue that needs to be resolved linked to the topic. You are given options that you have to work through and then the final section of the exam is where you make a decision about what should be done and you write a long answer response explaining your choices.

Component 3: Fieldwork paper. As with the decision making paper this exam will draw on any of the topics from the list above to test your understanding of the Geography surrounding the topic. Each year the exam tests a Methodology and a Concept: For this year the Methodology is Flows and the Concept is Sustainable Communities. We have covered both of these within our fieldwork – you need to revise how each of these relate to the fieldwork we have done both at the River and in Sheffield. You also must revise the



fieldwork techniques and our own fieldwork in the topics contained in the diagram here.
