

• Y7 Maths: Taught as mixed ability until February of Year 7 when we group into broad sets by ability. There is always room for movement within this system as your child progresses through their learning.





Arrive punctually: students have a MAXIMUM of two minutes to transition between lessons


Line up outside the classroom, enter quietly and ALWAYS follow the seating plan
