- Practice exam-style questions early and often - either past papers or on Smart Revise (the longer questions)
- Learn Algorithms by Tracing, not memorising
- Program little and often (especially Python) - paper 2 is a known weakness for most of the group

Top revision techniques

- Practise little and often – short, regular sessions (20–40 mins) help you retain methods better than cramming
- Focus on past papers – they're the best way to understand exam style, timing, and common question patterns.
- Master your formulae – learn the ones you must memorise and practise using the given ones confidently
- Fix your weak spots first – identify topics you avoid (fractions, algebra, vectors, etc.) and target them early
- Show every step – practice writing full working clearly; you get method marks even if the final answer is wrong
